

### Welcome

Dear Headteacher and Music Lead,

Since the last edition of our newsletter, many of the changes we predicted have started to influence the music education landscape in our three local authority areas. With Ofsted 'Deep Dives' into music now completed in several regional schools, there is a far greater focus on long-term skills progression and ensuring National Curriculum (or better) music provision is being delivered in all schools and academies.

The revised Ofsted Inspection Framework has been described as the most inclusive, child-centred, evidence-based and researched framework in Ofsted's history. Whatever your personal view, inspections certainly have a different focus and are leaving schools with a 'to do list' of tasks to ensure that music provision is in the best possible shape.

The Music Partnership has been developing support, guidance and resources in anticipation of this change and I'm pleased that networking sessions, requests for CPD and the on-site support that has been delivered this year have been well received by delegates and schools. We'll continue to facilitate sessions to share best practice and work with our colleagues who have been through the new inspection process to ensure we're fully prepared as a region and will work to support schools with delivery of the National Curriculum. Additionally, The Music Partnership will also continue its work to deliver the National Plan for Music Education (NPME) with all schools in our region whilst we await details of a revised plan for 2020-2030. https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/the-importance-of-music-a-national-plan-for-music-education

We are hugely grateful to our stakeholders, with whom we share a vision for excellent music education. They contribute in a myriad

of ways ranging from volunteering to donating to campaigns, buying into our music services or engaging in CPD, training or concerts and events for young people provided by our partners.

# To conclude, I would like to pick out some headline opportunities for the start of 2020:

- Please book a fully funded 'Music Audit' for your school and apply for an 'Excellence in Music Provision Award' as part of this process. This will ready your school for inspection and highlight the breadth of provision available.
- Book on to any of the 'low or no cost' events highlighted in this newsletter.
- Look out for the free networking opportunities throughout the year in all of our regions. We're working on being 'Ofsted ready' and you can meet colleagues who can talk about their experience of inspections.
- We are members of 'West Midlands Music', the voice of Music Education in West Midlands. WMM is running the Big Month of Music throughout March 2020, with the largest number of young people in the country celebrating music-making. Look out for details this term, there will be much that your school and pupils can get involved in.

Please contact your local music service if you have questions or want guidance to further develop music provision in schools or the local area. Best wishes for a successful 2020.

#### Musical Fun with Handa's Surprise

Explore beat, rhythm and music with an African flavour as we use instruments, movement and voices to accompany Handa in this lovely story which encompasses many wonderful elements friendship, thoughtfulness, some cheeky animals and a surprise at the end!

#### Aim

To share musical activities to enhance a well-known story and explore how this can support many aspects of your child's

#### **Objectives**

By the end of the workshop learners will be able to:

- List at least 3 musical skills practised together in the group.
- Name 3 ways in which sharing musical activities can help with children's overall development.
- Create a musical composition using percussion instruments to enhance the story.

#### Information for Parents/Carers

Workshop participants and their children will be able to join in with some African songs and games; they will have the opportunity to explore and play percussion instruments and add sound effects to enhance the story of Handa's Surprise, and will be able to discuss how sharing musical activities together can help their children's development in many different ways. Adults should come prepared to join in with singing, playing and movement activities alongside their children and to encourage and support their child during the workshop.

#### I'm not very musical...

No experience is needed – just come prepared to join in with the group and encourage your child as we sing, move, listen and play instruments

#### What will happen at the workshop?

This is a two-hour workshop. Adults will complete registration paperwork with a representative from Stoke-on-Trent Adult & Community Learning, who receive government funding to provide workshops and courses. Certain information is required for data/ funding purposes but personal information will not be shared. The tutor will then introduce the workshop and the group will do a short introductory activity before the children come and join in.

The children will return to their classrooms at the end and adults will complete paperwork and feedback.

#### Requirements from schools

- 10 -12 (max) parents/carers plus their children.
- A large space such as a hall for 2 hours.
- Chairs for adults (and children if possible).
- A drink and cups for refreshment during the workshop.

# Music Mentors Oldfields Hall Middle School

The Music Mentor initiative at Oldfields Hall Middle School in Uttoxeter has been running for five years and Head of Music, Sarah McBride attributes much of the success of the uptake of extra-curricular music making at the school to this scheme.

Prospective Music Mentors apply for the role at the end of Year 7 and successful applicants (10 this year) help to run the music clubs, are given extra responsibilities in the Music Department and are seen as role models by younger pupils in terms of commitment and effort in rehearsals.

This year the Yr 8 Music Mentors help to run a Ukulale Group, Yr 5&6 Pop Voices and Recorder, iMac and Music Practise Clubs at lunchtimes The Head of Music oversees these ensembles and gives training and guidance when required but freedom is given regarding repertoire and the Music Mentors are encouraged to promote the groups themselves.

#### Josh F, one of the Music Mentors said:

'I like the extra responsibility in school. It's really fun to share my musical skills with the younger pupils'. Another Music Mentor said 'It's good to get the chance to choose what we want to practise; I really enjoy working towards a performance and seeing our hard work pay off'.

Commitment is vital to the success of any ensemble and Sarah McBride really believes that having the Music Mentors as role models has been paramount in raising the attendance and standards of all the ensembles at Oldfields Hall. The School Choir and Orchestra are both run by Mrs McBride but Music Mentors know that part of their role is to set a good example to younger pupils in terms of behaviour, effort and commitment in rehearsals. This is also an excellent motivator for the present Year 7 pupils who are waiting for their chance to apply!

The Music Mentor scheme is a great way of giving children responsibility, encouraging peer working and team building, having a wider choice of ensembles available within the school and preparing children with skills they need for the future.

Young children in the Early Years Foundation Stage are enjoying a speech and language focused music project called 'Soundpots' that is being rolled out across nurseries in Telford. Delivered in partnership between Telford & Wrekin Music and Staffordshire music education charity, Make Some Noise (MSN), 'Soundpots' originated in Stoke-on-Trent where MSN teamed up with City Music Service in Stoke-on-Trent to deliver a music programme that engaged children who were at threat of speech and language delay.

'Soundpots' has a set of outcomes that focuses on developing children's communication, language, social and musical skills. The Make Some Noise music leaders work alongside Early Years practitioners to deliver music sessions that are sustainable. Musical activities are often bespoke and all are inclusive, taking account of children with very different needs, such as EAL (English as an Additional Language) and autism. Using a carefully chosen repertoire with plenty of actions, movement, props and sounds, the project's aim is to develop skills in staff as well as children, by teaching both new repertoire and helping them become more confident in delivering music. This all happens outside of nursery hours, with training delivered to nursery clusters. This is because music is widely recognised as an extremely effective conduit for young children's speech and language development.

'Soundpots' music-making is unintimidating. The sessions are informal, Shy and inhibited children feel at ease," says music leader, Lucy Vines, who is currently delivering a pilot 'Soundpots' in eight settings across Telford. "A child who may not speak will suddenly find their voice by playing the gathering drum. Sometimes the quietest children make the loudest noises with the instruments."

"It's not just the songs and activities that we see as bringing on the children. It's all the things that go on inbetween – turn taking, listening to peers, waiting, distributing and collecting up the instruments. All these are really important social skills that help get them schoolready," says Lucy.

'Soundpots' sessions are flexible so that the setting is utilised to get the most out of the sessions. Some consist of 1:1 interventions, in other nurseries up to 10 children are chosen for 'Soundpots', in other settings it can be the whole group. "The most important thing is that the nursery gets the most out of Soundpots" says Lucy, "So we have no fixed formula. All children are different and we adapt to their needs, personalities and abilities."

In this pilot, training for staff and practitioners working with the Telford Early Years Hubs has been included. The success of this approach has been enormous, with practitioners stating that the training has been the best they had ever received!

# Whole Class Ensemble Teaching (WCET) \*K2M in Staffordshire Landywood Primary School

Landywood Primary School understands the value of involving pupils in and developing a whole range of skills through musical activities, which are delivered as part of the K2M whole class ensemble programme with Yrs 3-6.

The end of year concert, held last July at Great Wyrley High School Theatre, was a great experience for pupils and the large audience of families that came to support. Whole classes of pupils had a brilliant time, performing to a high standard on percussion, brass, ukuleles, steel pans, violins, recorders and in the school choir, showing off the music and the skills they had learnt and developed during the year.

The K2M instrumental sessions are delivered as part of the curriculum, on the same day and time each week, by a team of four instrumental / curriculum teachers. The pupils make great progress and develop a wide range of mental, social and musical skills. Pupils can move onto a new instrument each year and so get experience of a variety of instruments and styles of music. Pupils are given the opportunity to become ambassadors for their instrument. These pupils are children identified as working at greater depth in music and having a talent for playing their chosen instrument.

These children learn more complex pieces and assist their peers. They are also given the opportunity to take part in the recorder group and choir run by school staff and elective instrumental lessons (paid for by parents) on violin and viola. All this means that pupils at Landywood Primary School get a great musical experience and build their confidence over 4 years.

#### Headteacher Mr A Clewer said:

"Landywood's Creative Curriculum enables all our pupils to learn through a broad and balanced curriculum. From Early Years to Year 6, we place great emphasis on all areas of learning, and music is one curriculum area we are particularly proud of. Our end of year 'Music Extravaganza' involves over two hundred pupils playing an instrument and singing. We are very proud of our music programme and believe it provides children with exciting learning opportunities. What is important is that what we do, we do because it helps to raise standards in our subject not because OfSTED says we should. Whatever we think of the inspection regime, improving the coherence of the learning experience can only be of benefit to the pupils we educate.

### What is cultural capital and how does music contribute to it?

Cultural Capital is about becoming well-rounded and educated citizens in our society. It embraces knowledge, values, language, attitudes and taste. Theorists suggest that these are more likely to be already embedded in those from middle class backgrounds and so schools should be providing opportunities for these qualities to be developed especially amongst disadvantaged pupils.

So how can we support the promotion of Cultural Capital in music? Could it be that we already do an aspect of this in teaching children how to perform, how to be good audiences (including turning our mobile phones off at concerts), how to listen effectively to music (rather than as a background) and to present themselves publicly.

Our society has many cultures and developing understanding and respect for them, and knowing how to conduct oneself in different cultural contexts can be taught through a focus on musical practices. It would be good to generate more discussion on this, and I would be interested to know what schools are asking music teachers to do to develop this area. # Awards for Young Musicians EAST MEETS WEST IN STAFFORDSHIRE!





A big part of the Awards for Young Musicians Furthering Talent programme is about expanding the musical experience and opportunities for young people via different instruments and genres or styles. Student Get Togethers is an opportunity for our students to work together and broaden their musical horizons. On 15 November at Entrust, Stafford, we arranged for two very new musical experiences for our AYM Furthering Talents students.

Taiko West brings hands on Taiko Drumming workshops throughout the UK. Led by James Barrow, they honour the traditions that underpin Taiko drumming to young people whilst also developing new musical directions and opportunities.

Make Some Noise has a plain and simple vision – provide high quality musical opportunities to inspire young people and to be a catalyst for positive change. Since 2001 they have engaged with over 45,000 people, delivering music projects across many different settings in local communities.

The Student Get Together started with a bang, in fact it started with several bangs from James Barrow, who demonstrated the thunderous sound of the largest Taiko Drum. Once he had got everyone's attention, students were given a drum and instruction started at a pace. Rhymical patterns were rehearsed, developed and structured to make an ensemble composition of many contrasting soundscapes. The ancient art of Japanese drumming through its unique technique and counting in Japanese brought authenticity to the work of the



Next up, DJ Moyma from Make Some Noise had two vinyl record decks ready to spin up a class act of modern music, incorporating the art of scratching. A masterclass demonstration by Moyma highlighted the level of technique, co-ordination and rhythm required. Pupils discussed music genres, styles and artists, as well as equipment required, before hitting the decks themselves and scratching their way into a new musical experience.



The Get Together ending with a performance of the Taiko drum composition. James signposted students to Taiko ensemble opportunities, and Maymo advised students on developing resources, equipment, technique and deck experience.

None of our AYM pupils in attendance had previously experienced either genre of music, originating from both the east and west. The two contrasting genres shed a bright light on new musical opportunities for everyone to pursue and develop further as a musician





Make Some Noise and Co-op Foundation Youth Loneliness Project

Make Some Noise (MSN) has been working with the Co-op Foundation and #iwill Fund to support the reduction of youth loneliness in the UK.

The National Lottery Community Fund and the Department for Digital, Culture, Media & Sport have invested £20 million seed funding over four years to create the #iwill Fund. The Co-op Foundation is acting as a match funder and awarding grants on behalf of the #iwill Fund.

Focusing on the transition from Primary school to Secondary school, last year Make Some Noise (MSN) worked with over 700 children and young people to reduce the stigma and effect of loneliness. The barriers of 'transition' can destroy a youth narrative on loneliness, through music-making we have developed a positive change in this narrative, allowing resilience and key skills to be developed.

In this second year of funding MSN is working with the Co-op Academy Secondary and St. Peter's Church of England Secondary, and 18 primary schools across Stoke-on-Trent using creative musical sessions to explore loneliness further. The project has helped the pupils involved to become more confident and resilient to change and able to support other young people going through similar experiences. This Social Action project supports pupils in developing skills around community engagement, marketing, planning and team work—last year resulting in a #iwill Rise pack for new pupils attending secondary school. The pack included a CD of songs written by the participants, an anthology of poems, a badge and wrist bands (to raise awareness of youth loneliness). Over 200 pupils attended our transition festival in July 2019 and benefited from participating in musical activity and received the pack.



During November 2019, the Co-op Foundation Marketing Team came down from Manchester to Stoke-on-Trent to visit the project in the Co-op Academy. Pupils were interviewed and filmed as part of a new campaign video, focusing on Youth Loneliness and Transition, being launched in early 2020. The Co-op team were highly impressed by the pupil's musical performance and their erudite responses to interview questions.

The Rise project participants surprised and impressed the team by writing a theme-based song in 10 minutes with the Make Some Noise Music Leaders and performing it live to camera. The project will continue with pupils for another year, supporting the reduction of loneliness and the resilience of participants through musical activity and social action.
